Presentation Description: A virtual project team is a group of individuals geographically dispersed who work across space and organizational boundaries to complete projects using communication technology links. This presentation will discuss the various reasons more projects in today's business environment are utilizing virtual teams, along with the benefits that can be obtained by use of virtual teams.

There are numerous barriers that can impede the success of virtual teams, and this talk will also discuss the top ten barriers along with strategies for removing these barriers. Project success is possible with a virtual team, provided the building blocks for success are properly done. This talk will also discuss the five keys to success when working with virtual teams spanning from getting started to managing the virtual team. An effective tool called the project e-communications plan will be explained, along with the available communication technologies that can be used. This presentation will help make your virtual team and project a success.

Biography: Rick Clare OCP, PMP®, CBAP®, CSM is the Business Analysis Practice Director and a Senior Instructor for PMCentersUSA, as well as an Oracle, Project Management and Business Analysis Consultant for ConsultUSA. Rick has more than 25 years of experience as a developer, business analyst, trainer and project manager. Rick is responsible for maintaining the BA courseware, providing expert consulting services to companies moving into the business analysis world for the first time, and constructing customized training material targeted at an individual company's methodologies.

Rick's early career experience was as a Senior Oracle Database Developer, performing analysis, design, development and documentation on numerous database systems using Oracle and its complete set of development tools. He has worked on projects that involve all aspects of the application development task, including strategy, analysis, design, build, implementation and production, as a business analyst and project manager. His training background is as an Oracle instructor, course developer and technical school administrator. He has delivered training to many organizations such as: General Physics Learning Technologies, the US National Guard, and the Oracle Corporation. He has also led an intensive 32 week Oracle career course for EIS in Canada.

Rick has written numerous documents including course material, help manuals, installation instructions, and system manager guides. He has presented at numerous conferences, such as Oracle's IOUG, the Oracle Developer Tools User Group (ODTUG) conference, the Building Business Capabilities Conference, the Project Management/Business Analysis World conference, and the PMI Global Congress. He led the IIBA's Chapter Development Committee and orchestrated work and contributed to a new IIBA book about managing Business Analysts. As a result of his effort, Rick served on the IIBA's Senior Leadership Team as Vice President of Chapters. He is a graduate of the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. Rick earned his CBAP® in 2008 and his PMP® in 2009 along with Certified Scrum Master (CSM) in 2012. Rick is originally from Canada, but now lives and works in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The Fifth Edition of the PMBOK® Guide is published! PMI members can download a free pdf file at www.PMI.org.

The PMP Exam will continue to follow the existing PMBOK® Guide Fourth Edition through 30 July 2013. Starting 31 July 2013 the PMP Exam will be based on the new PMBOK® Guide Fifth Edition.

If you are planning to become a PMP soon we suggest taking the class staring on 16 February 2013 to prepare to take the exam before 30 July 2013.

A significant change to the PMBOK® Guide is the addition of a new knowledge area for Project Stakeholder Management.
