Topic: Innovation in Healthcare

Presented by: Dr. Arthur A. Boni, John R. Thorne Career Professor of Entrepreneurship, Carnegie Mellon University Location: ESWP, 337 Fourth Ave, Pittsburgh, PA 15222

Speaker Biography: Dr. Arthur A. Boni, Ph. D. is the John R. Thorne Distinguished Career Professor of Entrepreneurship at the Tepper School of Business at Carnegie Mellon University. He is also the co-director of the Agile Innovation System, a partnership between CMU and Innovation Works to accelerate innovation originating in universities using lean, agile and needs driven principles. He joined the Tepper School faculty in 2003 and directed the Donald H. Jones Center for Entrepreneurship from 2006 until July 2012. His teaching and research interests include: entrepreneurship and new venture creation, commercialization of technology and biotechnology, venture capital investing, innovation and entrepreneurship in organizations, leadership and broad-based ownership in entrepreneurial companies, and evolving business models for the biopharmaceutical and

alternative energy industries. In 2005, Dr. Boni and Steve Sammut of the Wharton School and Burrill & Co.,co-founded and has served as National cochair of the Annual Biotechnology Entrepreneurship Boot Camp held at each subsequent annual meeting of the international Biotechnology Industry Organization (BIO) Annual Meeting. He also serves on the Editorial Board of the Journal of Commercial Biotechnology.

Prior to joining the faculty at the Tepper School of Business in 2003, Dr. Boni was in the private sector where he was engaged in building and leading entrepreneurial organizations in the technology and life science industries. He was a senior level officer at Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) for 10 years during its growth from several million in annual revenue to nearly \$1B. He then founded and led an organization focused on creating startups and in the creation of four start-up organizations. He then founded and led the Office of Technology Management at the University of Pittsburgh and became a founding partner at Saturn Life Science Partners prior to joining the CMU faculty.

Topic: The Plan's Journey: Scope to WBS to Schedule

Abstract: The completed project schedule is a vital, living artifact that helps guide the project team to a successful conclusion. Its journey to completion starts back before the project even launches, when the Business Case is used to justify the project's existence. It continues through Requirements and Project Scope, through the Work Breakdown Structure, through Estimation of hours and duration, to eventually become a resource-loaded Project Schedule. This presentation will look at all of these evolutionary steps, carefully examining the methods and pain points for each stage

Speaker Biography: Rick Clare OCP, PMP®, CBAP®, CSM is the Business Analysis Practice Director and a Senior Instructor for PMCentersUSA, as well as an Oracle, Project Management and Business Analysis Consultant for ConsultUSA. Rick has more than 25 years of experience as a developer, business analyst, trainer and project manager. Rick is responsible for maintaining the BA courseware, providing expert consulting services to companies moving into the business analysis world for the first time, and constructing customized training material targeted at an individual company's methodologies.

Rick's early career experience was as a Senior Oracle Database Developer, performing analysis, design, development and documentation on numerous database systems using Oracle and its complete set of development tools. He has worked on projects that involve all aspects of the application development task, including strategy, analysis, design, build, implementation and production, as a business analyst and project manager. His training background is as an Oracle instructor, course developer and technical school administrator. He has delivered training to many organizations such as: General Physics Learning Technologies, the US National Guard, and the Oracle Corporation. He has also led an intensive 32 week Oracle career course for EIS in Canada.

Rick has written numerous documents including course material, help manuals, installation instructions, and system manager guides. He has presented at numerous conferences, such as Oracle's IOUG, the Oracle Developer Tools User Group (ODTUG) conference, the Building Business Capabilities Conference, the Project Management/Business Analysis World conference, and the PMI Global Congress. He led the IIBA's Chapter Development Committee and orchestrated work and contributed to a new IIBA book about managing Business Analysts. As a result of his effort, Rick served on the IIBA's Senior Leadership Team as Vice President of Chapters. He is a graduate of the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. Rick earned his CBAP® in 2008 and his PMP® in 2009 along with Certified Scrum Master (CSM) in 2012. Rick is originally from Canada, but now lives and works in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Academic Outreach

A GREAT Mentoring Opportunity to give back to the future of Project Management!

The Community and Academic outreach teams are joining forces to plan a Black Tie Event this fall where all proceeds benefit the 2014 Intercollegiate Project Management Triathlon (Duquesne University Sponsored Jeopardy Style Student Competition on the PMBOK). We are working with the Duquesne University Student Project Management Association (PMA) to plan this event. We have identified sponsors from PMI and Duquesne, a Project Manager from PMI and a Controller from PMI. 29 eager students have expressed interest in participating on this project team! The benefits of this event/mentoring include:

Give the students the opportunity to apply their learning's from their PM classes while working side by side with top Project Management Professionals in the Pittsburgh area. Give the students some real experience they can list on their resumes and hours of PM experience that can be used to sit for the CAPM or PMP exams one day. Plan a nice evening for PMI chapter members and their spouses to enjoy. Give the students the opportunity to raise significant funding for the 2014 IPMT Competition. Give PMI members the chance to earn up to 45 PDUs for mentoring, and the overall sense of satisfaction that comes with being involved in such a great cause! Improve our future generation of project managers in the Pittsburgh area; facilitate networking between grads and employers to identify great entry level candidates. We plan to guide the students step by step through the project planning process and give them hands on direction on everything from gathering requirements, WBS breakdown, project scheduling, risk management, etc., all while planning a real event. Our project manager, Robert Martin, has taken on a great responsibility but will need help from other PMI members who are experts in specific areas. Our thought is that the Project Manager will schedule working sessions with the students throughout March and April (until they break for the summer), we will identify the deliverables for each scheduled session, and we will bring in mentors who are experts in each subject area, and they will lead the students through each process hands on...actually walking them through identification of risks and mitigation plans, and so on.

We need 9-10 volunteers to act as mentors; each one will choose a specific PMBOK knowledge area that they feel comfortable with. Each mentor will be required to attend one group working session that covers said knowledge area (approximately a 2 hour commitment), then be available to the students via email over the next week to answer any follow-up questions and review the final deliverable, making any necessary changes to finalize the document. We expect each mentor to have one week of engagement from the session through to finalizing the deliverable before the next session begins on the next knowledge area. The planning phase will last 8 weeks during March and April and the specific timing will depend on the

knowledge area you choose. We will also require mentors to assist with execution, monitoring and controlling of the project when the students return in the fall from August through the date of the event.
