Topic: Who's in charge...of your career? Career Planning Strategies

Abstract: No one cares, or should care, as much about your career as you. Do you have a dream? Do you have a plan to achieve that dream? You need to take charge of your career and formulate your plan to reach your dreams. Ken uses a project management model to present valuable lessons on career planning strategies. The model includes the 5 process groups, each with a set of processes to help develop career planning.

- 1. Initiation: identifying requirements (geographic, financial, personal, professional, and any others), identifying key stakeholders (family, friends, and colleagues) and involving them in your planning process.
- 2. Planning: expanding the dream into a vision with a mission, goals and objectives (discussion of measurable goals and objectives needed to achieve the dream)
- 3. Execution: putting the plan into action (includes discussions on networking, resumes, and interviewing).
- 4. Monitoring and Controlling: keeping control of budget, schedule and performance (includes discussions of why it is necessary to have a good grip on expenses, timelines, and achieving goals, why it is important to document progress compared to the plan so that you can make necessary changes intentionally and not accidentally).
- 5. Closing: What next?

The process never stops, once you have achieved your immediate dreams it is time to start thinking about the next step. Where do you want to be in the next 10 years?

Speaker's Bio: Ken has over 43 years experience in Department of Defense and private sector program and project management, operations, planning, and program support. Experience includes air and missile defense operations, planning, and threat assessment; and program schedule, cost, and performance support. Over 20 years of that experience was with the US Army including assignments to the Army Staff and to the Office of the Secretary of the Army. Retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel, Ken made the successful transition to the civilian world and for the past 23 years he has held increasingly responsible program/project management positions supporting the Department of Defense. He earned his PMP in 2005. Ken has taught PMP Exam Prep both on the PMI-NAC instructor team and under contract to UAH. In 2010, Ken started Ken Grant Consulting, a project management consulting practice focused on helping small businesses establish and maintain successful projects at affordable rates. In 2012, he moved from Huntsville, AL to Wake Forest, NC where he continues with his consulting practice and coaching others with career transition and development strategies.

The Carl Pritchard Scholarship supports development of the best and brightest future project management professionals in the Greater Pittsburgh area through learning opportunities.

The Pittsburgh Chapter named this scholarship in honor of Carl Pritchard, to express its gratitude for his continuous support of the Pittsburgh Chapter.

Carl Pritchard has been a long-time member of the Pittsburgh chapter. He was keynote speaker at many of the Pittsburgh Chapter Meetings. Carl Pritchard has also offered our Chapter Members multiple opportunities to participate in his Pittsburgh based seminars.

Carl Pritchard is the principal and founder of Pritchard Management Associates. He is a recognized lecturer, author, researcher, and instructor. As a lecturer he is considered a leading authority on risk and communications management and presents on a variety of management topics, ranging from project essentials to the complexities of network diagramming and team motivation. As an author and researcher, he has published articles on project management language, advances in risk management, and on the challenges of training on the Internet. His work as an instructor has taken him around the world, training with some of the leading international training organizations, as well as for private clients and the Project Management Institute®.

The scholarship is not restricted to PMI Pittsburgh Chapter member and is open to:

- College and University Students Students at the bachelors, masters, and doctoral levels who are studying project management and related fields
- Educators Primary and secondary school teachers and administrators who wish to implement project-based learning in the classroom
- Non Profits Employees of non-profits and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) who wish to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of their operations
- Professionals Project management practitioners, who wish to improve their professional capabilities

The scholarship will award a maximum of \$500 per year, which may be awarded in whole or in part to one or more individuals each time. The scholarship will be awarded to

cover all or a portion of the tuition to a training seminar offered by the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter such as the PMP Preparation (PMP Prep) class or the Professional Development Day (PDD).

Criteria for the Carl Pritchard Scholarship:

The applicant must live in the area that the specific PMI Chapter serves. (Zip codes beginning with: 150-162, 166,168)

PMI Pittsburgh Chapter Board Members and selection committee are not eligible.

Deadline for the application: 2 Months before training start

The PMI Pittsburgh Chapter will hold all applications until the deadline and the Scholarship in whole or in part will be awarded one month before the training start.

Winner must be willing to be photographed and will allow name and photographs to be used for publicity purposes.

Election for the Board of Directors

Each year at the October Chapter meeting, nominations for position are presented by the Chapter Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee is chaired by the Past

As stated in Article V of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter Bylaws, the following board positions are designated for the election process this year and will hold the office for years 2014 and 2015:

- VP Finance and Administration
- · VP Education and Certification
- · VP Membership and Volunteers

Position Descriptions

The following are but brief descriptions for each of these positions. Please refer to the Chapter Bylaws on the website.

The VP Finance and Administration shall oversee the management of funds for duly authorized purposes of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. Duties shall include but are not limited to the responsibility for the development, preparation and presentation of an annual financial plan, management of all Chapter financial transactions, establishing and maintaining all information required for Chapter bank accounts and other investments, submitting all required tax related filings on a local, state, and federal level, developing and obtaining approval for an annual operating budget, etc.

The VP Education and Certification shall facilitate education and training opportunities for the advancement of the project management profession. The duties shall include but are not limited to assessing the ongoing educational needs of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter, coordinating and overseeing efforts of volunteers working to: develop and provide seminars, PMP training sessions, et al; acting as a liaison with PMI® for certification information.

VP Membership and Volunteers shall support membership growth and retention of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. The duties include but are not limited to the responsibility for the development and maintenance of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter membership retention and growth plans, and overseeing the constant volunteer efforts within the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter.

The officers elected to these positions will serve one, 2 year term of office beginning January 1, 2014.

Timeline for the nomination/election process

- September 30: Dead line for chapter members to email the Nominating committee declaring their interest for a particular position. Please include your Bio, 2x2 inch photograph, and qualification for the position.
- October: The nominating committee will post their selections on the website, in the newsletter in October, and present the candidates at the October chapter meeting. Posted information will include the candidates' name, bio and photograph.
- October through November: The electronic ballot will appear midnight Thursday, October 10, 2013 and be available through midnight Sunday, November 3, 2013.
- November: The successful candidates will be announced at the annual Membership meeting on November 14, 2013.

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
