The Five Key Baldrige Strategies you will learn to implement are:

- <u>Hardwire BHA Goals</u>: This is at the foundation of your success, without this your project is doomed before it starts.
- <u>Unleash Customer Loyalty:</u> Understanding who your customers are and getting them to keep coming back for more.
- <u>Cultivate an agile project team:</u> How to fully engage your Project Team.
- <u>Apply the 85% Rule:</u> Learn how to save \$50M or more by improving Key Work Processes.
- <u>Inspire Accountability and an Owner's Mentality:</u> How to overcome the most destructive shortcoming in most organizations today.

Bio: BOB STEARNS is one of only 95 people in history to lead an organization to win the prestigious Malcolm Baldrige Award, leading Medrad to win it in 2003. The Baldrige Award is presented annually by the President of the United States.

Bob founded Powerful Potential 28 years ago. He works with clients in five areas:

Bob's has written a book about his Baldrige journey titled" Perhaps a Man Can Change the Stars". He is a sought after International Speaker, having spoken in eight countries. Election for the Board of Directors

Each year at the October Chapter meeting, nominations for position are presented by the Chapter Nominating Committee. The results of the election will be presented at the November Chapter meeting.

As stated in Article V of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter Bylaws, the following board positions are designated for the election process this year and will hold the office for years 2014 and 2015:

- · VP Finance and Administration

- · VP Membership and Volunteers

Position Descriptions

The following are but brief descriptions for each of these positions. Please refer to the Chapter Bylaws on the website.

The VP Finance and Administration shall oversee the management of funds for duly authorized purposes of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. Duties shall include but are not limited to the responsibility for the development, preparation and presentation of an annual financial plan, management of all Chapter financial transactions, establishing and maintaining all information required for Chapter bank accounts and other investments, submitting all required tax related filings on a local, state, and federal level, developing and obtaining approval for an annual operating budget, etc.

The VP Education and Certification shall facilitate education and training opportunities for the advancement of the project management profession. The duties shall include but are not limited to assessing the ongoing educational needs of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter, coordinating and overseeing efforts of volunteers working to: develop and provide seminars, PMP training sessions, et al; acting as a liaison with PMI® for certification information.

VP Membership and Volunteers shall support membership growth and retention of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. The duties include but are not limited to the responsibility for the development and maintenance of the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter membership retention and growth plans, and overseeing the constant volunteer efforts within the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter.

The officers elected to these positions will serve one, 2 year term of office beginning January 1, 2014.
