Our workforce is rapidly changing, but is your leadership? Your leadership style must transition from a system of control and compliance to autonomy and freedom.

- Implement the ChangeGrid: Motivate, monitor, measure, manage change
- Identify the strengths of diverse thinking styles: Right brain/left brain
- Integrate the psychology of "flow" and challenge to avoid apathy
- Learn why trophies and the "carrot and stick" no longer motivate
- Trigger basic human needs: Autonomy Mastery Purpose
- Implement ROWE: Results Only Work Environment

- 1. Capitalize and harmonize the strengths of diverse thinking styles
- 2. Implement a system of <u>intrinsic</u> motivation to engage all employees
- 3. Explain how managing levels of tension eliminates entitlement, motivates change, and transforms apathy into optimal performance
- 4. Increase productivity: Develop a culture of constant creativity and learning

Activities: The Change Grid: Each participant will experience the power and process of this dynamic change management tool that predicts performance. Based on interviews and your input, relevant and interactive role playing and work simulation exercises will provide behavioral insights and skill development. Sociodrama, a method of experiential learning, allows participants to physically enact their perceptions and positions on team issues for conflict resolution.

Topic: The 'Consumability' Challenge in Healthcare: Role of Informatics and Analytics

Presented by Rema Padman

Abstract: Increasing deployment and usage of electronic health records and availability of vast amounts of patient data in electronic databases are challenging our ability to utilize them effectively at the point of decision making. This talk presents two examples that combine healthcare informatics with large scale data analytics to deliver substantial

cognitively guided information to decision makers for improved care delivery and outcomes.

Bio: Rema Padman is Professor of Management Science and Healthcare Informatics in the H. John Heinz III College at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. She is also a Thrust Leader of Health Informatics Research at iLab at the Heinz College, Adjunct Professor in the Department of Biomedical Informatics at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, and Honorary Professor in the School of Health Sciences at the University of Salford in UK. Professor Padman received B.Tech. in Chemical Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur, India, PhD in Operations Research from the University of Texas at Austin and National Library of Medicine Senior Fellowship in Applied Informatics from The University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine.

Dr. Padman's current research examines healthcare operations & decision support and process modeling & risk analysis, in the context of information technology interventions such as e-health, m-health and chronic disease management. Her research has appeared in many scholarly journals and has been funded by the National Science Foundation, National Library of Medicine and the Centers for Disease Control, among others. She has served on review panels for the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health in the US, and the Medical Research Council in the UK, and advised healthcare informatics projects for organizations such as Jewish Healthcare Foundation, IBM Research, Johnson & Johnson, UPMC, Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, Deloitte and GlaxoSmithKline.

5th Annual Inter-Collegiate Project Management Triathlon



Date: March 28-30, 2014

The Inter-Collegiate Project Management Triathlon (IPMT) is an undergraduate level competition hosted by Duquesne University and is sponsored as well as supported by PMI and the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. This event tests competitors' knowledge of the PMBOK® Guide and their responses to project case-based scenarios.

There are three competitive events where the participants can showcase their project management knowledge: Team Quiz-Bowl: Teams of four students will compete in a Jeopardy-style event. All questions will be based on the PMBOK® Guide and at a difficulty level equivalent to that necessary to achieve the Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM®) designation. (The form of the questions will be fill-in-the-blank or short answer.)

Individual "All-Star" Quiz-Bowl: This is also a Jeopardy-style event, to be played exclusively by individuals, and it will follow a similar format to the Team Quiz-Bowl. Participants will be selected based upon the degree of knowledge s/he has shown in their individual performance in the team event.

Quick Fire Team Challenge: During the competition weekend, teams of four participants will be given a project management scenario and asked to develop and submit three work products. Teams will be evaluated on how well the team performs developing the work products. The same teams that participate in the Quiz Bowls will participate in the Quick Fire Challenge.

In between competitive events, participation in team building activities, which require physical and mental dexterity, is encouraged. These activities are designed to provide competitors an opportunity to relax and have fun.
