Abstract: The Agile methodology is gaining traction worldwide. With it come many questions regarding the role of the Project Manager in an Agile environment. Some suggest that the PM is no longer necessary. Other suggest that the term "Scrum Master" is just a synonym for Project Manager. What is reality? Russ Fletcher will explore the role of PM vs. Agile "Coach" and give an introduction to the Servant Leader concept that is vital for an Agile team.

Bio: Mr. Fletcher is a seasoned IT executive and a recognized Agile methodology expert (Scrum, SAFe, Lean, etc). Beginning with leading development teams, then moving on to whole IT departments and eventually whole companies, Mr. Fletcher has spent more than 20 years making IT a competitive advantage and a strategic strength for his employers, clients and students. For the past six years Mr. Fletcher has championed and led enterprise-wide Agile transformation programs, first as an IT executive, and then as a outside advisor, coach and consultant.

What sets his IT teams and departments apart is their unique combination of high-level strategic thinking with superior, Monday-morning-Inbox tactical delivery. Since 2007 Mr. Fletcher has been using a hybrid form of Agile Development Methodology (primarily Scrum, with practical components of Lean, XP, and test-driven development). Mr. Fletcher's unique blend of business acumen and technical understanding make his development management approach incredibly valuable for employers.

5th Annual Inter-Collegiate Project Management Triathlon

The Inter-Collegiate Project Management Triathlon (IPMT) is an undergraduate level competition hosted by Duquesne University and is sponsored as well as supported by PMI and the PMI Pittsburgh Chapter. This event tests competitors' knowledge of the PMBOK® Guide and their responses to project case-based scenarios.

There are three competitive events where the participants can showcase their project management knowledge:

Team Quiz-Bowl: Teams of four students will compete in a Jeopardy-style event. All questions will be based on the PMBOK® Guide and at a difficulty level equivalent to that necessary to achieve the Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM®) designation. (The form of the questions will be fill-in-the-blank or short answer.)

Individual "All-Star" Quiz-Bowl: This is also a Jeopardy-style event, to be played exclusively by individuals, and it will follow a similar format to the Team Quiz-Bowl. Participants will be selected based upon the degree of knowledge s/he has shown in their individual performance in the team event.

Quick Fire Team Challenge: During the competition weekend, teams of four participants will be given a project management scenario and asked to develop and submit three work

products. Teams will be evaluated on how well the team performs developing the work products. The same teams that participate in the Quiz Bowls will participate in the Quick Fire Challenge.

In between competitive events, participation in team building activities, which require physical and mental dexterity, is encouraged. These activities are designed to provide competitors an opportunity to relax and have fun.

Educational institutions are limited to entering two (2) teams to participate in the IPMT Competitive Events. Universities that have participated in previous IPMT competition include:
