The disciplines of Enterprise Architecture, Portfolio Management and Project Management have competing needs and complimentary benefits in organizations that promote collaboration and transparency in pursuit of measurable value. We'll take a look at the dynamic, symbiotic and sometimes contentious relationships of these three critical competencies and how they can not only co-exist, but inspire the best in each other for the good of the whole.

Bio: Robert Sheesley is Senior Director, Enterprise Architecture at Mylan, Inc. In this role Robert is responsible for developing, implementing, evolving, and managing the Enterprise Architecture practice for the global IT organization. Robert was previously Director of Strategic Technology Optimization, Corporate Information Services at

UPMC, and Program Director at HEALTHeLINK™, western New York's Regional Health Information Organization (RHIO), where he was responsible for project leadership of a \$10 million Health Information Exchange (HIE) program to implement a state-wide clinical data exchange with an emphasis on clinical information among disparate health care information systems specific to child health immunization, newborn screening, syndromic surveillance, and chronic disease. Robert has over twenty-three years of experience, including Interim CIO and senior leadership roles, business and technology transformation, and delivery of mission-critical technology solutions designed to reduce operating costs, sustain customer loyalty, grow market share, and increase business value. Robert is both a writer and public speaker, having authored and delivered material for professional associations including Project Management Institute (PMI), Health Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS), Health Technology Research and Advisory Council (HTRAC), and the Association of Information Technology Professionals (AITP). He has served on executive round table panels for Information Week, authored white papers on merger and acquisition planning and integration, and business architecture, and has provided commentary on business process management for CIO magazine. A United States Marine and Operation Desert Storm Veteran, Robert is an active member of the Board of Directors of the Western Pennsylvania Chapter of HIMSS, and of Access Community Health Network, Chicago's largest private health care provider to the under-served and the nation's largest community health center. Robert is a founding member of the International Association of Innovation Professional and serves as co-chair of the Architecture Innovation Work Group. He also serves on the Industry Advisory Board for HTRAC. Robert has held numerous leadership roles including Director, Health and Life Science Solutions with Syndicus, Inc., CIO Advisory Services Practice Leader for West Monroe Partners, National Insurance Practice Leader for Alvarez and Marsal Business Consulting, and Director Claim Technology for CNA Financial. He has a master's in Business Administration and a bachelor of science in Communications from Clarion University of Pennsylvania, and holds a Certified Business Architect (CBA®) designation with The Business Architects Association (BAA™). In his free time Robert enjoys golf, camping, hiking, running and mountain biking.
